Day 1 **USA – EDINBURGH**

Afternoon Fly overnight to Edinburgh via major international scheduled airline. Change of plane enroute. Dinner and breakfast served aloft.

Day 2 **EDINBURGH**

Morning Arrive at Edinburgh International Airport.

Greeting by your highly-qualified **Tour Manager**. The Tour Managers we select are chosen for their high-energy and commitment to customer satisfaction. For the duration of your stay, your Tour Manager will be coordinating and managing all of your scheduled activities and will be available to you on a 24-hour basis should you need special assistance.

Edinburgh has a long and storied history as the focal point of Scotland's struggles between union and disunion with England. Today it is the capital of Scotland with its own parliament but is still part of Great Britain. The city's royal past and present are amply represented by such landmarks as Edinburgh Castle and the Palace of Holyrood House. Edinburgh offers the visitor an experience steeped in culture, history and beauty, highlighted by its many historical structures backdropped by the imposing Arthur's Seat mountain that is nestled just behind the city.

Royal Yacht Britannia tour (admission fee included)

Transfer by private motorcoach to the Royal Yacht Britannia for a tour of the British royal family's former yacht for foreign travels. View five decks on the self-guided tour of the 5,862 ton, 412-foot long ship, including the fabulous State Apartments, State Dining Room, crew's quarters and even the Engine Room.

Continue on your private motorcoach to Edinburgh. Check in to your Three-Star Hotel.

Afternoon Free time to explore the neighborhood around your hotel and have lunch on your own.

Day 3 **EDINBURGH**

Morning Breakfast at Hotel.

Morning **Edinburgh Castle Tour** (admission fee included)



Take a guided tour of **Edinburgh Castle**, Edinburgh's most compelling attraction dramatically perched high on a rock above the city and worthy of a Hollywood movie script. The famed Mary Queen of Scots lived here and gave birth to her only son James in the castle in 1566.

Visit the **Royal Palace**, including the **Crown Room** with a spectacular crown, scepter, and sword dating from the 16th century. Visit the **Great Hall**, the **National War Museum of Scotland**, the **Prisons of War Exhibition**, and take a quiet moment in **St. Margaret's Chapel**. Also view the huge 550-year old **Mons Meg** cannon which weighs over 13,000 lbs.

Afternoon **Palace of Holyroodhouse & Holyrood Abbey** (admission fee included)

Arthur's Seat

Visit the **Palace of Holyroodhouse**, the royal family's official residence in Scotland. Highlights include the **State Apartments**, the **Throne Room**, the **Great Gallery** and Mary Queen of Scots' **Bedchamber**, **Supper Room** and **Outer Chamber**. **Holyrood Abbey**, a ruined abbey founded in the 12th century, and the **Palace Gardens** are adjacent to the palace.

Arthur's Seat Mountain (free admission)

Climb this small, yet imposing, 822 ft. high mountain from its base next to the Palace of Holyroodhouse. The easy 60-minute hike yields great views of the city of Edinburgh and surrounds extending to the **Firth of Forth** waterway.

The **Royal Mile** in **Old Town** is a street lined with cafés, restaurants, shops and historical buildings that is so-named because it stretches for a mile downhill from Edinburgh Castle to the Palace of Holyrood House.

Shopping includes crafts, gifts and jewelry. Sites on or near the Royal Mile:

Scottish National Gallery – (free admission)

This art museum features works of the Old Masters and Scottish Masterpieces.

Real Mary King's Close – (optional - admission fee of approx. US\$ 20 additional)

Take a spooky guided tour of these subterranean labyrinths, hidden deep beneath Edinburgh's Royal Mile, for insights into daily life in the city in the 16th and 17th centuries.

Canongate Tollbooth – (free admission)

Built in 1591, it was here that the tolls or public dues were collected. It also served as the council house, courtroom and prison for the Canongate. Found inside today is the "People's Story Museum".

Scottish Parliament Building (free admission)

Delight in this architectural masterpiece designed by Catalan architect Enric Miralles.

The city's most popular shopping districts are **Princes St.**, with larger stores featuring Scottish woolens and the pedestrian **Rose St.** with smaller shops.

EDINBURGH – GLASGOW

Morning

Check out and transfer by your private motorcoach to **Glasgow**. (1:30 transfer time)

Check in to your Three-Star Hotel.

Glasgow was once a grimy industrial city but today is a modern, sophisticated and cultured community remade primarily into a service center based on financial and business services, communications, biosciences and other modern industries. Larger than Edinburgh, Glasgow has always been less glamorous but the city has a substantial history and several recently-built larger-than-life structures, such as Lord Foster's Clyde Auditorium, the Clyde Arc, and the Glasgow Tower and Science Centre, which have reenergized the city.

View Glasgow's main sights, such as **George Square**, the main square in the heart of the city, and **Merchant City**, a historic shopping and leisure area highlighted by the grand neoclassical exterior of the **Royal Exchange**, which now houses the **Gallery of Modern Art**. Continue on past the **Glasgow Cathedral** and see the **Tall Ship**, which is a 245-foot long three-masted vessel dating back to 1896 available for tours.

Explore the delightful small town that is best known as home to the world's most famous golf course, the **Royal & Ancient Golf Club**. Visit the **Old Course**, which has often hosted the world's most prestigious golf tournament, the British Open (note that access to the club might be restricted until play is over for the day). Check out the **British Golf Museum** and wrap up the day at **St. Andrews Castle**, a short walk from downtown. Return to Glasgow.
